

# PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT

For the year ended 30 April 2011



I have pleasure in presenting my first Annual Report.

## **Earthquake**

The major earthquake that struck on Tuesday 22 February 2011 was an event of enormous significance that will have a long term affect on our sport. To all our clubs and members who have all been affected in some way by the devastation in Christchurch the upheaval in their lives as a consequence of the earthquake has been immense. A large number of volunteers assisted many clubs with removing liquefaction from greens.

While Bowls Canterbury headquarters came through the earthquake remarkably well with only minor damage to facilities, there were 19 greens and 11 Clubhouses seriously affected and some have decided to merge with other nearby clubs.

Bowls Canterbury set up an Earthquake recovery group initiative as we need to coordinate a recovery response to the rebuilding efforts of greens and premises, as a part of our commitment to the sport. This is an enormous task and club members need to know what is going to happen and when. The task will be long and costly for a number of clubs.

We would like to thank those from parts of the world and New Zealand who have offered their support, thoughts and financial help.

## **Financial**

The year ended with an operating deficit of \$15,615 compared to \$17,715 last year.

The cost of restructuring including redundancies was \$43,536 and this had an important bearing on our financial results for the year.

In July 2010 we borrowed \$30,000 from Bowls New Zealand to assist us with extraordinary financial assistance resulting from the need to restructure. Bowls NZ may waive repayment of this short term loan made earlier in the financial year subject to the Centre providing, for Bowls New Zealand Board approval, a recovery plan which includes an updated Strategic Plan, an operations plan for the next financial year and a financial plan supporting the future direction. Once the Board is satisfied with these proposals action will be taken to write the loan off.

## **Grants**

Bowls Canterbury Inc is the Regional Sports Organisation for bowls in Canterbury. We have 70 bowling clubs in our area and more than 5,000 full playing and casual members.

We rely heavily on the gaming Trusts for our survival and to grow our sport. I acknowledge the following Grants received between 1 May 2010 and 30 April 2011 and we thank them for their generous support and record our sincere appreciation.

## **Judicial Committee**

The Board appointed a Judicial Committee during the year comprising Ian McNish, Neil Johnstone and Roy Bailey.

Only one incident has been dealt with by the Committee this season and was resolved in the way of a fine.

## **Rationalisation**

Facility rationalisation as a result of the earthquake is being investigated in collaboration with the Christchurch City Council and Sport Canterbury. A number of clubs have approached us as the Regional Service organisation to assist them with an economic analysis on their future viability due to the high costs of restoration after the earthquakes.

While it is a decision for clubs, under the One Bowls One Vision service agreement we are required to encourage the strengthening of clubs by facilitating mergers

where circumstances warrant, and to promote and target alliances with nearby clubs. The dramatic financial impact of 22 February aftershock has provided a unique opportunity for some of smaller clubs to join forces for sustainability reasons.

The Board has set up a working party following the Special General Meeting who will work with clubs to establish the short term needs to deliver our sport. The aim is to establish the best delivery structure and locations for our needs and make recommendations to the Bowls Canterbury Board. The working party comprises the following representatives. At least five members representative of bowls clubs in Canterbury, sport Canterbury and Christchurch City Council representatives.

### **Regional Centre**

In line with the one bowls one vision strategy we have implemented the service agreement with Bowls New Zealand.

While there have been a number of factors affecting our performance we are following the operating model aimed at advancing the number of people playing our sport and setting down a foundation to ensure the efficient delivery of services to our sport.

We have assumed the role of the Southern Regional Centre with certain roles being redefined. I record that we are under resourced but our financial position at this point in time limits what progress can be made in implementing the Bowls New Zealand strategic direction.

### **Restructuring**

During 2010 the Board took the necessary course of action to restructure our sports administration that was an essential course of action to survive and to deliver outcomes our members require as our relationship with clubs had reached very low ebb. With new management we have made considerable progress and have changed the culture towards building a new Southern Regional Centre and are now a professional organisation and our goal is to increase the productivity of our staff and to ensure that they are more responsive to our members needs.

The action we have taken has shown good progress towards shaping our Centre for the future. Our strategic plan is clear about the strategy to reshape our sport and position it to drive the One Bowls One Vision growth strategy.

### **Board**

After 5 years on the Board Grant Evans has announced his resignation effective from the end of the Annual Meeting. We greatly appreciate the service he has given and the contribution he has made to Bowls Canterbury. My sincere thanks also go to Judy Herkess who has given much of her time voluntarily to assist in many ways.

It has been a focus of the current Board to ensure transparency in all it does and to keep members informed and involved in the decision making process.

There has been a significant internal change programme with policies and procedures which continues to be positively received both internally and externally

The Board restructured the organisation in July 2010, which was a difficult time for all involved. Several staff took redundancy as a part of the re-organisation that was absolutely necessary in order to implement the Regional Service Centre agreement with Bowls New Zealand.

I would like to extend the heartfelt wishes from the Board to those families, friends and colleagues and clubs impacted by the quake. As the Christchurch clubs rebuild they will need a helping hand and we are committed to assist where possible. 22 February is not a day that any of us will forget and our thoughts are with those families who lost loved ones.

# **Regional Chief Executive Annual Report**

## **For the year ended 30 April 2010**

My first seven months in the role of Regional Chief Executive have been challenging, with a number of events that are not a normal part of our operations creating uncertainties for many clubs and participants. In addition, we have assumed the role of the Southern Regional Centre as a part of the one bowls one vision strategy. There are 403 South Island Clubs and 10 other Centres in the South Island.

### **Earthquake**

The earthquake of 4 September 2010 and ongoing aftershocks have had a negative impact on our sport. Due to the devastation that occurred on 22 February 2011, causing significantly more damage than the first major earthquake, the cost to our affected clubs is high so the starting date of the 2011-12 seasons interclub still remains uncertain at this time due to greens availability. A further series of quakes and aftershocks on and after Monday 13 June have indicated that many of our greens are still susceptible to liquefaction. Nineteen greens and eight clubhouses have sustained major structural damage. Some of these will need to be fully assessed by structural engineers and the New Zealand Sports Turf Institute. Our findings have been that many clubs are underinsured with no greens, business interruption and many do not have replacement insurance for premises. Indicative costs of individual green repairs are as high as \$60,000 per green and we anticipate that the duration to get clubs up and running will be longer than anticipated.

Our partners have been Cequent Projects, the NZ Sports Turf Institute who has provided an outstanding contribution to Clubs with technical advice, the Bowls Canterbury Green Keepers Association and their members and Bowls New Zealand staff.

In the short to medium term, it is very difficult to predict what will happen to green renovations as the continuing aftershocks are affecting green levels.

### **Financial**

Over the past few years the financial performance has returned deficits and this will need to change to surpluses in order for the Centre to fare better financially.

We rely heavily on gaming trust grants for the payment of salaries, representative team costs and equipment. During the year we received gaming grants of \$170,500 compared to \$188,121 last year in despite of some gloom and doom predicted by my predecessor. The aftermath of the earthquake will create more competition for funds while many hospitality sites in the CBD, the location of many gaming machines, no longer trade.

The financial results for 2010-11 have returned a deficit of \$15,615 compared to \$17,715 last year. When the non cash expense of \$14,391 for depreciation and \$13,997 for the holiday pay provision is taken into account income exceeded expenditure for year. We have been assisted by a grant of \$50,000 from Bowls New Zealand to fund administration and other costs associated with Region 3, the South Island.

Unfortunately, restructuring was a necessary evil and those one off costs of \$43,536 had an impact on the financial outcome this year.

## **International players**

During the year there were some outstanding performances by our international players. Jo Edwards has performed with distinction and is now ranked as the top ranked female bowler in the world. Jo has taken out the world bowls singles title for three consecutive years which is a fantastic record. From our prospective Jo will be a big loss to Canterbury and we wish her our best wishes for the future when she returns home to play in Nelson. Jan Khan is not far behind as seventh seed and also achieved some remarkable results during the year. At the annual prize giving, Jan was awarded the trophy for the inaugural sportswoman of the year award and won the women's singles again and earned a gold star for her 15<sup>th</sup> Centre title.

Andrew Kelly of the Canterbury Club achieved success with some magnificent performances at Hong Kong Classic bringing home a silver medal. He also finished fourth in the men's junior world cup. Andrew, along with Nathan Glasson from the Belfast club represented New Zealand in the successful under 25 Trans Tasman test series. Andrew was also awarded the trophy for sportsman of the year.

Brittany Tyson of Lincoln made her debut for New Zealand in the under 18 Trans Tasman test series which was a great learning experience for someone so young.

On the local scene, an emerging player who is destined for higher honours who won the junior singles for the third consecutive year and the champion of champion singles and triples was Ashley Diamond of Cashmere.

Darren Redway also won the Christchurch Bowling Club sponsored singles for the third year in succession, earning him his tenth Centre title and gold star. Graeme Stanley also earned a new gold star for 15 Centre titles.

The consistency award went to Gill Abel of Beckenham. Gill won the Centre junior singles, and along with Linda Boyd and Rosemary Finch the Centre triples, and this three along with CJ Hargrave won the Centre fours. Their first Centre titles.

## **Regional Centre**

One Bowls One Vision strategy has been the sole factor behind the delivery and substantial change programme across our sport in the past six months. While we have not achieved some of the key performance indicators set down by Bowls New Zealand, there have been some factors such as the earthquake, affecting performance.

However most of the strategic direction is one off and I am confident that after a slow start we will continue to work very closely with Bowls New Zealand in reaching the necessary goals and I am expect the Southern Regional Centre will be a leader in the future direction of our sport in New Zealand.

## **Staff**

I thank our staff for their commitment during the year. While some staff took redundancy, and some was re- employed, the process of change was a stressful time for those staff and members of the Board who managed the change process. Several Board Members showed

very strong leadership and took hands on approach administering the sport, during the vacuum period and their hard work has been appreciated.

I must strongly acknowledge the assistance provided to Bowls Canterbury by Bowls New Zealand staff. I record our sincere appreciation for the outstanding service that has been provided by the Community Development Officer, Vince Roper after the national disaster that Christchurch experienced. I am pleased to report that the relationship with our national body has been restored and we look forward to continue an excellent working relationship with them in future.

### **Volunteers**

Bowls Canterbury is blessed with a willing band of helpers that are essential to run our sport. I record our appreciation to those involved for sacrificing their time for your benefit to administer the sport and I thank them for a job well done.

These members include the operations and match committee, coaches, selectors and umpires. Thank you to the markers who helped when required for singles events.

Members of the Bowls Canterbury Greenkeepers Association, who are noted for being the best in the world, have helped immensely throughout the year especially after the earthquakes.

### **Outlook for 2011-12**

Our team is now more customer focused and during 2011-12 we propose to build a Regional Sports Organisation that is a successful business and is ready for the challenges that are in front of us. We are committed to continually transform our sport and set the scene for an exciting growth story for lawn bowls in spite of the recent setback and we must remain positive to growth at all times. We will focus on growing our sport and for our members to access the necessary advice and assistance for clubs to become more enthusiastic about the long term opportunities and growth capabilities of their clubs. This will be challenging after the events we have faced, and leaders must emerge to take our sport and clubs forward in a positive way.

#### **UMPIRE**

Ruth qualified as a Bowls New Zealand registered umpire in 1999. Updates are required every three or four years with her latest in December 2010. She has officiated at numerous Bowls Canterbury events over the past 12 years that she has been qualified. In early 2011 Ruth ran an education session for umpires covering what is required of an umpire officiating at a Bowls Canterbury event.

#### **COACH**

Ruth became a Bowls New Zealand coach in 1992. Subsequently she became a BNZ 1 coach, then a CNZ 1 coach. She became a BNZ 2 coach and then completed her CNZ 2 coach training which qualified her to work with representative teams.

She has coached extensively at club level and attended and run the Bowls Canterbury winter coaching programme since 1995. Ruth became a life member of Bowls Canterbury Coaching in 2009. She received the Sport Canterbury Sports Award for Lawn Bowls Coach in 2005. She was President (and Secretary when there was no one else in the position) of the Bowls Canterbury Coaching Committee from 2003 until 2007.

#### **Bowls Canterbury Winter Coaching        1995 to 2010**

Organised and ran (with help) for Junior and later development players over three months each winter. Wrote and delivered these programmes under the watchful eye of the Director of Coaching. Travelled to Ashburton and Dunsandel to assist junior players to improve their game over the winter months. Trained potential higher performance coaches to run these sessions by helping them to write and run the programme.

#### **Coach Tutor (now trainer) since 1996**

Became the coach tutor for women bowlers in 1996 and extended to tutoring men in 2000. On the current data base of 107 coaches in Canterbury, Ruth has tutored or had direct input into 75% of those coaches. She has also tutored coaches in South Canterbury and on the West Coast. She has helped organise and run many updates with coaches having to update every two years.

### **General Coaching**

- She was asked by the selectors to be the women's Junior Representative Coach in 2001. Two years later when Bowls Canterbury started appointing coaches to travel with representative teams Ruth was officially appointed.
- Ruth has worked with secondary school students including three years working with students from Unlimited paenga tawhiti school each Wednesday in term one and four.
- Developed a format for Kiwi Bowls for which she organised coaches to run the sessions and later trained up the clubs to take over the role. Helped to run sessions at New Brighton in 2010 until they could take over the format.
- 2010/11 coached at New Brighton and South Brighton weekly from September through to December 2010 for new players.

### **BOWLS CANTERBURY OPERATIONS COMMITTEE**

Ruth has been involved with this committee since 2004.

- In 2010/11 she attended every monthly meeting and wrote the minutes
- Formatted and printed all the fixture booklets for each Centre event and posted them out etc
- Helped with each draw
